THE COLLECTED PAPERS OF H. S. ISBELL

In 1988 the CARB Division published "The Collected Papers of H.S. Isbell". This three volume set, containing 1795 total pages and a total of 188 research papers, was published to celebrate the 90th birthday of this eminent carbohydrate chemist. At that time, the Division also established a young investigator award in his name and that award has now been given each year to the top, young carbohydrate scientists in North A merica.

Professor Isbell spent much of his career at the National Bureau of Standards and then joined the American University's Department of Chemistry in 1967. Professor Isbell passed away in 1992 at the age of 93. Soon after, the Horace and May Davidson Isbell Chair of Natural Products Chemistry was established at the American University to honor him and his late wife.

Professor Isbell left a lasting mark on carbohydrate chemistry. His work was pioneering and led to much of our present knowledge about carbohydrate chemistry.

Through advertisement in our Division's Newsletter and through direct mailing activities, the Division has sold about 250 copies of the "Collected Papers" sets. However, we still have around 200 sets left and we are in the process of finding new homes for them, since ACS can no longer house them in their present space.
